We find ourselves face to face with the laborer on \$5 a week. He has but one room for himself and his family of three or four children. By self-denial, by abstinence from drink, by daily toil, he and his wife are able to feed and clothe the children. Pleasure for him and for his is impossible; he cannot afford to spend a sixpence on visit to the park, nor a penny on a newspaper or a book. Holidays are out of the question, and he must see those he loves languish without fresh air, and sometimes without the doctor's care, though air and care be necessities of life. The future does not attract his gaze and give him restful hours in thought; he cannot think of a time when work will be done and he will be free to go and come and rest as he will. In the laborer's future there is only the grave and the workhouse. He hardly dares to think at all, for thought suggests that to morrow a change in trade or a master's whim may throw him out of work, and leave The laborers—and it is to be re-ally rewarded.


