Accidents of various kinds are of frequent occurrence now-a-days it is probably worth while for all to know what to do in case of a serious flesh wound that penetrates to veins or arteries. When a man is wounded so that the blood flows, that flow is either regular or by jets and spurts. If it flows regularly, a vein has been wounded, and a string should be bound tightly around below the wounded part—that is beyond it from the heart. If the blood comes out by leaps or jets, an artery has been severed, and a person may bleed to death in a few minutes; to prevent which, apply the cord above the wound—that is, between the wound and the heart. In case a string or cord is not at hand, tie the two opposite corners of a handkerchief around the limb, put a stick between and turn it around until the handkerchief is twisted sufficiently tight to stop the bleeding, and keep it so until a physician can be had.

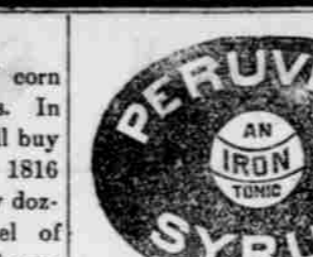
