The Last Bourbons.

Two notable men lie at the point of death, Jefferson Davis in this country—the Count de Chambord on the other side of the Atlantic. The one a Bourbon president who never presided over a real government; the other a Bourbon king who never sat on a throne. In private life both are pure, accomplished, amiable, honorable gentlemen. But neither of them belongs to the present generation. So far as any active, real association with the events of the day is concerned, they have long been dead.—Jefferson Davis represents a dream which has had a rough awakening and is ended. The Count de Chambord represents a mesmeric trance, the one vision of which continues on and on while the mesmeric lies motionless and powerless. Years ago, Jefferson Davis sat in imaginary power in Richmond, with a Secretary of State who had no diplomatic relations, a Secretary of the Navy without a ship, a Secretary of the Treasury with a budget of Confederate bills. Longer years ago, the Count de Chambord held an imaginary French court in a London square, where the Legationists knelt before his easy-chair and went through the court etiquette of kissing the royal hand and swearing allegiance to Henry V.

Doubtless de Chambord still clings to the belief that he might one day wear an actual crown, sit on a real throne and once again crown France with the glory of the elder Bourbon rule. It is too much to believe that Jefferson Davis sometimes had a shadowy idea of the "lost cause" and the ephemeral presidency of the Confederacy might be revived? If these two distinguished but bygone gentlemen now pass away, many hearts will be saddened by their removal, perhaps the more sincerely because of their loneliness and sorrows. But the world will revolve as usual without knowing that an ex-president and a throneless king have been gathered to their mother earth.

An Exploded Charge.

Those protectionists who continually howl about the influence of "British gold" in this country will not relish the statement made by Mr. David A. Wells in the Princeton Review concerning their most absurd charge. According to the charges of the virtuous and truthful protectionists the Cobden club has been the instrument for circulating this "British gold" for debauching the honesty of our people and the amount circulated has been over "millions of dollars." But Mr. Wells shows that the total income of the Cobden Club has never been in any one year over \$40,000, and that the total amount of money collected and expended by that Club since its existence has not even equalled the sum charged by Mr. W. D. Kelley as having been expended in one year alone by British agents in this country to influence free trade legislation. The fact of the matter is, the protectionists find the people are looking too closely into their arguments and they make this cry of foreign influence in order to distract attention. They do not mind prevaricating if they think it will help their cause.
