The Washington National Republican says: "It was reported that the Vanderbilts, Sidney Dillon, the Chinese five companies, and two or three steamship lines had combined to build a railroad across the Isthmus at Chiriqui, in opposition to De Lesseps' canal.

The road, if it should be built, can be put through for \$5,000,000 or perhaps \$4,000,000, less than the Panama road, whose stock is worth about \$200.

Congress appropriated \$2,000,000 a year ago for the establishment of naval stations near the proposed terminal points of the projected road.

The stations have never been established, and the appropriation will lapse July 1st, unless measures are taken to locate them before then.
