The original road cost less than \$10,000 a mile, and that too, when rails were sold for double the present prices. At present prices a first-class road, amply stocked, ought to be built from the city to the river for \$250,000. The article from which we quote is in the same view and well illustrates the corroboration of our views by those who see in the opportunity they suggest a means of freeing themselves from the exactions of a monopoly and getting the grain to the consumer at less cost (and therefore increased profit to the producer) than by present methods.
