The *A. B. Field* will leave for Tillamook June 9th.

The postoffice will be closed today from ten A. M. to five P. M.

The Skapanon road will certainly be built before the next transit of Venus.

Misses Alice and Lon Wygant of Portland are in the city, the guests of Mrs. Dr. Trenchard.

Over 2,500 fish were received at one cannery in this city last Monday, but last Monday was a good day for fish.

About 4,500 cases of salmon are on the Main street wharf, for the *Ullock* which will load 40,000 cases.

Nearly 2,000 feet of sewer pipe arrived on the *Tam O'Shanter*, which E. R. Hawes will put in at Fort Stevens.

The *Columbia* and *Walla Walla* arrived yesterday; the *State* sails today. The *Victoria* will go northward about Friday.

The *Skamokawa* sawmill has been having additional machinery furnished by the Astoria Iron Works. This mill will soon turn out 100 M per day.

Tak's little stroll around this morning, if you have time, and see the immense amount of building and improvement that is going on in the city.

A new lodge K. of P. No. 19, was instituted at Salem last evening. The order is fast increasing in membership and influence throughout the state.

Peter Dolson, an old resident of this place, who has been ailing for a long time, died at his residence last Monday night. The funeral will take place today.

In yesterday's *News* appears a Washington dispatch signed by Adjutant-general Drum, stating that Jas. H. Lappes deserted from the United States army at San Francisco, May 28, 1848. The *News* comments on the statement at great length.

Work on the Odd Fellows' building which has been retarded from various causes, is about finished. The black walnut counter, in the lower story is a fine piece of work. It is of Astoria manufacture and compares favorably with any carpenter work in the building.

There will be no public observance of Memorial Day in this city, as opportunity does not offer to here strew flowers upon soldiers' graves. The day will, however, be appropriately observed as a semi-holiday, and at the forts military salutes will be fired.

One could yesterday say, "It is a warm day" without fear of successful contradiction. Straw hats and linen coats were above par, and the seductive lemonade and ice cream were in requisition. Even the little fishes in the deep blue sea felt the influence of the warm air, and swam merrily into the Columbia.

The American ship *Oracle*, Captain Morrison, recently lost off Cape Horn while bound to Liverpool from San Francisco, was well known in this port from the fact of her making the passage from Liverpool to Cape Henlopen in twelve days, perhaps the quickest passage ever made by any sailing vessel in the world. The latter part of the passage was remarkable, she having overcaught and distanced the famous *Guion* line steamship *Alaska*, and the *Imman* steamship *City of Berlin*, and was reported at the Delaware capes when the English steamers were seen off Long Island, on their way to New York.

The *State of California* sails today for San Francisco. When she arrives here again, says the *Oregonian*, Captain Debnay will have made 100 consecutive voyages on his fine ship between San Francisco and Portland. She has made the best time ever known between these ports, and during the four years she has been on the route has carried many thousands of passengers in safety and comfort. She never did better work, Capt. Debnay says, than on her last trip. She left San Francisco thirty-four hours after the *Umatilla*, and had a strong gale dead ahead all the way. When the *Umatilla* arrived at Astoria she reported that the *State* would not be in on that day, but she was there in a few hours all right. Capt. Debnay is justly proud of his gallant ship, which carries the broom, and long may it wave, and may he make another hundred consecutive trips without accident, is all the harm he is wished.

Northwest Canneries.

Will McGregor, who arrived down on the last Alaska steamer from Bonquet Inlet, where the Cape Fox Canning company is located, reports that the salmon will begin running there about June 1st. A good catch is anticipated. The *Idaho* landed men and machinery at the wreck of the *Burles* who expect to get her afloat once more. There salmon business in the northwest starts out lively this season.

The Northwest Trading company and the Chilcat Packing company, at Chilcat, are nearly ready for business, having erected a very large cannery east, and they are expected to put up 20,000 cases each this season, and also several thousand barrels of salt salmon. Beside these there are a number of smaller canneries and places at which they are salting salmon. The Northwest Trading company at Killisnoo are making great work among the codfish. They are drying and boxing it for market. This will soon be a great industry for the country, and the very small price at which fish can be bought makes it an easy matter to compete with the east. Ten Indians catch with lines from 2,000 to 3,000 fish per day, and if they had any of the improvements for catching them, they could supply more fish than twenty companies could eat. At Sitka Captain Morrison has the old government boat house all in order as a cannery. He expects to salt several thousand barrels of fish this year.

At Smith's Inlet Quashel & Co., had closed in their cannery buildings and were making cans; at Rivers Inlet Company were going up, and other improvements were in progress. The buildings of the Victoria Packing Company are all up. The Metlakahla Indians have gone to work for \$35 per month. Ten boats are out on Skeena River. The Windsor Company have no boats out, but are ready for business. Cunningham & Co. have put up the first seventeen cases. The Balmoral company had about sixty fine salmon in their shed the morning the latter sailed. The Inverness company are ready, but had sent no boats out. The Indians want \$45 a month. The Alert Bay cannery is ready for the run. The fish are expected to come in large numbers from now till the last of October.

More Recruits

The *Columbia* arrived in at eleven yesterday morning. Her docks were black with passengers, a portion of the advance guard of the grand army of civilization that is pushing out from "western" homes by the Ohio and Mississippi as did the ancestors from across the sea generations ago. The immigrants aboard of yesterday morning's steamer, were a hearty, healthy lot of folks who come here on business. They do not start from their old homes to hang around large cities and live on swill; they come to take possession; to get land and cultivate it; to build homes and raise families and send children to school who will become educated and grow up and run for office and be just as American as any of us.
