A Big Swindle

The business of the Olympia land office still continues to engage the full time of the clerical force. Immense tracts of land are entered daily, and a great deal of it is falling into the hands of land nigs and monopolists. The timber land law is practically a farce. The government proposes to sell to actual settlers land unfit for cultivation and commercial in per acre for a quarter section. The oath of the applicant prescribes that it shall be taken for his own use, and that he has not contracted, directly or indirectly, for transfer of title to anybody. Still scores of men admit that they have sold their "timber right," the standing price being \$100. It is not unfrequent for those interested in the objects of the timber "cruisers" to approach citizens with a proposition to sell their birthright for the proffered mess of pottage-\$100.
