A SAN FRANCISCO dispatch says arrangements have been made by Captain B. B. Tuttle for the transmission overland of mails for Oregon and Washington Territory from the east, which, it is believed, will materially shorten the time of their transit. Instead of being sent in the usual manner the mails will be taken off the overland train at Sacramento, and thence forwarded to Portland via Redding, by stage to the extension of the Oregon and California railroad from Roseburg. Mails arriving one day previous to the sailing of Portland steamers will be landed at San Francisco and forwarded by water. The new arrangement went into effect on the 11th.






