HABITS OF CALIFORNIA OBTRICHES.

The editor of the Anaheim (Cal.) Gazette has been viewing the ostriches on a ranch near Costa Station. He says: "The female lays an egg on alternate days to the number of fifteen, when, if permitted to set, she considers her work done. If, however, her eggs are taken from her, she will lay thirty before she discovers the deception. And such eggs! The one showed us weighed three and a half pounds, and contains food sufficient to furnish a plentiful breakfast for four men.
