High License Law.

The Harper, or high license bill has become a law of the state of Illinois. Its operation will be the most important and interesting test yet made of the new theory of promoting temperance reform by high rates of license.

The new law is of a type different from that of Iowa—a state where the experiment of high license has also been tried, but without the uniformity of rate which characterizes the Harper bill.
