Ordinance No. 448. SECTION 1. That no person or persons shall fire or ignite any fireworks, torpedoes, bombs, or other species of fireworks within that portion of the city of Astoria which is east of Lafayette street and north of the south line of Squemoqua street, according to McClure's recorded plat of Astoria, and north of the south line of Water street, according to Shively's recorded plat of Astoria.

Sec. 2. That any person or persons who shall be convicted before the police judge of this city, of violating any of the provisions of section one (1) of this ordinance, shall be fined not more than one hundred (100) dollars at the discretion of the police judge, together with the costs of the prosecution, and in default of payment of such fine and costs, the offenders shall stand committed to the jail of this city, until payment of said fine and costs, for a number of days specified, and not exceeding ten (10).

It is a queer condition of captivity in which the newspaper reporters who had been sent from foreign lands to describe the coronation of the Russian Czar found themselves. They were hospitably received, and each man was presented with a rather costly gold badge and a small sum of public money, the latter ostensibly for carriage hire. But when they were ready to send their dispatches they found themselves entirely in the power of their hosts. Nothing was permitted to be sent out of Moscow that did not tell the story the censors wished to have told—a story of the splendors of the occasion and the joy of the people. It is asserted that one of the reporters endeavored to send a letter to his paper in London by mailing parts of it in separate envelopes to the addresses of friends, but only two sheets of it reached their destination. The period of their captivity being over, the reporters were entertained at a costly banquet.

The Eastern newspapers are full of anecdotes of poor Charley Backus, the dead minstrel who for a generation held sway in the affections of fun-loving people. About three months before his demise, and while visiting Rochester, N. Y., he was invited to visit a very fine, tall, and large business building called Powers' block, then newly erected on the main street. He was told that a beautiful view of the city and a glimpse of Lake Ontario could be obtained from the roof. The building contained no elevator, and the minstrel a very heavy and short-winded man, climbed and climbed traversing flight after flight of stairs between the ground floor and the roof. On the top story he halted opposite a door and rapped until the janitor's daughter responded. "Excuse me," said Backus, puffing and panting and mopping his face with his handkerchief, "but is St. Peter in?"

In nine states of the Union elections are to be held in this "off" year of 1883. Kentucky votes August 6th and Ohio and Iowa on October 9th. In the former state the Republicans already have a ticket in the field headed by Judge Foraker of Cincinnati, and the Democrats Judge Hoadley, while in Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania and Virginia, November 6th is the day fixed for electing state officers. Of these political battle grounds that of Ohio is regarded as the most important just now, and as a consequence, all eyes are turned in that direction. The National Republican says of the Buckeye state that she "is in the throes of one of the most complicated fights that the history of that exceedingly interesting state has ever known."
