It shall be unlawful to ceep open my store, shop, saloon, res-aurant or other public house or place of ousiness or amusement, or to carry on, conduct, or transact any business there-a between the hour of twelve o'clock midnight and the hour of five o'clock hidnight and the hour of five o'clock the following fore moon within the cor-porate limits of the City of Astoria, and any proprietor of any such place of business or amusement, causing or per-mitting the same to remain open or any business to be carried on or transacted therein between said hours, shall, upon therein between said hours, shall, upon being convicted thereof, be fined not ex-eceding one hundred dollars, and shall pay the costs of the prosecution, or be imprisoned in the jail of said city not exceeding iwenty days.
