The statement that responsible parties have offered to build the Astoria road for the land grant and present the road after its completion to the company is received by persons representing the party of the second part with wild incredulity. The Oreganian is assured that the company would only be too glad to accept an offer which would imply a gift of three million dollars. At present an effort is making to ascertain by actual survey whether in view of the nature of the country and the probable amount of traffic, which the land grant throws in, it would be a sound business enterprise to undertake the construction of the road or not. If that be decided in the affirmative, construction will soon be undertaken. If in the negative, the enterprise will be given up and the land revert without objection from the company to the public domain.
