It has been reported to the treasury department that the British parliament is considering measures looking to the prohibition of the introduction of cattle from foreign countries where the foot and mouth disease prevails, and that an attempt will probably be made to have it apply to importations from the United States. It is stated at the treasury department that such application foot and mouth disease does not prevail among the cattle of this country. Steps will be taken to bring this fact to the attention of the British government, to the end that its orders on the subject may not be made applicable to the importation of cattle from this country.

THERE are produced annually 100,000 barrels of hemlock bark extract, of which a single firm produces 72,000 barrels. They own nine extract-works and operate twenty-three tanneries. the tanneries of the United States consume annually 1,250,000 cords of hemlock, produced in nine states. 




