What man that reads this but recognizes the truth? We have known instances where men of good standing and respectability, and more than ordinary conscientiousness have put a little money where it would do the most good in the hope of keeping off the jury list. We are talking now of something that occurred a thousand miles from here, and mention it to illustrate the feeling that the average citizen has toward serving on a jury. This is the great trouble, and till men take a pride in this matter, till men can be induced to look upon it as a matter of business interest, and essential to their individual and community prosperity, the jury system of the United States will be a reproach and a discredit to our civilization.
