What Skilled Tradesmen Call Inferior Hands

Strikes bring out the technical slang of the trades, and partieglarly the opprobrious epithets with which the different classes of workmen distinguish the unskilled operatives who labor at the same trader. In most cases it will be found that there slang terms origlimbs in some technicality of the trade. Thus the telegraphers call a poor operator a "plug," after the little metal implement which divides the switches on the Dyspansia, Nervous Siles Cons. Con key-board, masmuch as the plug, or they," is a comparatively unimportant part of the machinery. Printers designate an unskilled type-setter a "shoemaker" or "blacksmith." The derivation of the former appellation is from the fact that the compositor who makes errors is obliged to exceet them after the type is set up by taking out the mispineed letters and "pegging" the proper ones in their planes. Tailors also use the word "shoumaker" to distinguish a poor hand, as an unskilled workmen takes his stitches too far apart, and he therefore better adspired to saw leather, where he can punch holes with un awl before putting his needle through, The appellation "blacksmith" is applied to a printer whose fingers are clumsy, and a jeweler also terms an unskilled worker at his trade a "blacksmith" for the same which was used by old New York printers to designate an unskilled ompositor, was the word "bearder," from the fact that a your hand one generally a drinking man, and spent his time loading or "boardng" in liquur saloons. All strikng trades workers in common use the generic word "scab" to distinguish workmen who take the place of strikers. The derivation is obviously from the fact that the scab is a morbid growth, and lives being of the rest of the body. Compositors call a scab a "rat," in entemptuous allasion to the rodents who infest printing offices. The telegraphers have only recently invented a term for scab perators. They call them "contumists," though the application is not of technical derivation, but is probably an attempt to manufacture a word from the Latin con-


