The Postal Telegraph.

It is understood in New York that J. W. Mackey has agreed to back the Postal Telegraph company to the extent of \$1,000,000. He does this by advancing to it money upon its securities, with the privilege of buying these securities at a certain price. The officers of the company say that the sum Mackey has agreed to advance will be sufficient for all the construction the company wishes to do in the next twelve months. They deny the reports that Mackey is to be made president of the company. So far as can be learned it has not been determined who will be made president. The work of extending the company's lines from Chicago to St. Louis and St. Paul will be begun at once.

Russell Sage stated, when asked what he thought of the prospects of the Postal Telegraph company: "This new blood won't amount to anything. I know both Mackey and Roberts. Mackey has considerable wealth and his name will go a great way in that respect. For the sake of the stockholders, I hope they will have better than did those in the Consolidated Virginia and California mines with him. I and several of my friends were interested in them with Mr. Mackey. The great trouble with our stockholders was that we could not see so far into the rock as Mackey could, so we got left and Mackey got rich. I hope that the stockholders in this telegraph scheme will be better able to see into the rock than I was into the mining scheme."

"But supposing the Postal Company takes in the Southern, Merchants' and Bankers' and American Rapid companies, and also forms a new system, won't that make a formidable rival of the Western Union?"

"It might prove a rival like some we have had before. All of these have come to us, however, and have been anxious to sell out and we have had to accommodate them, so far. I don't know what course we shall take if a new rival springs up."
