The Earth's Population.

The latest estimates by German scientists of the total population of our earth are, in round numbers as follows:

Australia	4,000,000 inhab.
Europe	315,000,000 inhab.
Africa	305,000,000 inhab.
America	89,000,000 inhab.
Asia	830,000,000 inhab.

Europe is the most densely populated of the continents; Asia contains more than one-half the inhabitants of the globe. As long as there is evidently room for untold millions of people, there need be no fear of over population. According to their religious creeds, the above 1,443,000,000 may be classified thus: 312,000,000 Catholics, 124,000,000 Protestants, 84,000,000 Mohammedans, 7,000,000 Israelites, 200,000,000 Mohammedans, 163,000,000 Brahmins, 423,000,000 Buddhists and 320,000,000 Pagans.

The programme for the opening of the Northern Pacific Railroad has been outlined at great length. In the history of railroading in the United States, there has perhaps been no occasion of the kind that has approximated the trip in contemplation, the details of which are now being perfected. The trains will be composed of baggage cars, day and dining cars, and Pullman coaches, and will be equipped with everything needful and convenient for the guests, who will be expected to be "at home" in the cars from the time they start from their place of abode until they are returned and landed where they began their trip across the continent to assist in the inauguration of the third great artery of commerce that stretches two thousand miles away from the shores of the Great Lakes to the North to the Western shores of the broad Pacific.

The Swedish monitor *Thor* has foundered near Norrkoping, adding one more to the list of ships lost at sea beginning with the *Monitor*. The crew were saved. The *Thor* was a 1,475 tons burden, and belonged to the arm of the service known as the "Coast Artillery," and was one of the finest monitors in the service, resembling our *Pascov*, which nearly foundered on her first trip. She carried two nine and one-fourth inch Finsporg rifles, mounted in a single elliptical turret, the armor of which was of iron ten and one-half inches thick, with backing of twenty-six inches of wood. Her armor at the water line was five inches thick.
