The programme for the opening of the Northern Pacific Railroad Junay City Hamars, N. J. has been outlined at great length. In the history of railroading in the United States, there has perhaps been no occasion of the kind that has approximated the trip in contemplation, the details of which are now being perfected. The trains will be composed of baggage cars, day and dining cars and Pullman coaches, and will be equipped with everything needful and convenient for the guests, who will be expected to be "at home" in the cars from the time they start from their place of abode until they are returned and landed where they began their trip across the continent to assist in the inauguration of the third great artery of commerce that stretches two thousand miles away from the sheres of the Great Lakes of the North to the Western shores of the broad Pacific.

The Swedish monitor Thorlaca has foundered near Norrkoping, adding one more to the many ost at sea beginning with the Monitor. The crew were saved.
