To-day Henry Villard, president of the Northern Pacific R. R. Co., will drive the last spike on the road, and that transcontinental line will be a finished fact.

As years go it puts the country a century in advance of what it would be without the road. The future and its conditions depend largely upon ourselves.

In eighteen days it will be ten years since Jay Cooke's failure threw down the splendid scheme that that financier had planned, and set back indefinitely the completion of the road.

The difference in the surroundings is striking. When Stanford finished the Central Pacific he was surrounded by a crowd of financiers; Villard to-day is surrounded by an assemblage of foreiguers.
