Steel Nails

At first the extra cost of steel nails was 11 cents per pound, or \$1.50 per keg, but it has now been reduced to \$1. The great advantage of the steel nails is that they can be driven into hardwood as easily as an iron nail will go into a pine board. Steel nails have been driven into a white oak knot without bending. Nothing else is now used in laying hardwood floors, as they require no boring, but are driven readily. For all kinds of finish they are especially adapted, and as so much hard finish is now employed, their use must be on the increase. They are also used largely by builders, and box makers are increasing their demand for them. Boxmakers have been using the better grades of iron nails, as they desire those that can be drawn and re-driven.
