

To Cure Corns

A "corn" consists of a small mass of the outer layer of the skin much thickened. It is produced by occasional pressure from tight or ill-fitting boots. A corn may be hard, dry and scaly, or soft and spongy, as when it forms between the toes. It may become inflamed, and even have matter formed beneath it, when the pain is intense. The early treatment is simply to remove the cause and the corn will disappear. Get well fitting boots, for boots too loose are as bad as boots too tight. Their uppers should be broud. To eradicate a corn, the best way is to soak it in warm water, and for two or knife, great care being taken that the knife does not go too deep and inflict an unnecessary wound.
