Planting Fish in the Sea

furnishing young game fish to stock the fresh water streams of the country, is planning to replenish the failing supplies in the sea. He is fitting up a hatchery at Wood's Hall, Mass., and expects soon to be able to put into the water 500,000,000 young codfish annually. It might seem that the ocean is a large place in which to distribute the fish, but it is said to be the habit of the finny tribe to return aboundly to the shore where they are hatched and to make that their spawning ground in the future. Putting the fish into the ocean, therefore, is pracinto the ocean, therefore, is practically a move to stock the particular portion of coast where the fish are deposited. 
