A Specimen.

The following from the "bear" column of the N. Y. Sun, is a specimen of the sort of Wall street arguments that has caused the present flurry in Villard stocks:

Stocks—128,535 shares Oregon railway and Navigation Company's stock, 151,300 shares Northern Pacific Railroad company's preferred stock, 162,792 shares Northern Pacific Railroad company's common stock—\$42,613,632.06.

The Philadelphia Press of the 25th says: There is no longer any doubt that the raid on the Northern Pacific aims to destroy Villard's power, and it is almost certain it will be accomplished.

MR. GLADSTONE has held the office of premier for a longer period than it has been held by any statesman except one in the course of Queen Victoria's reign.

A NEW YORK dispatch of the 25th says stocks opened firm and advanced 1/4 to 2/8 later. Northern Pacific preferred sold up to 65; Oregon Transcontinental rose to 55 1/2; Northern Pacific common to 34; Southern Pacific to 89 1/2.
