An officer of engineers a few days ago made a dynamite belt, donned it, and blew himself to atoms. A day or two afterward a prominent doctor put an end to his life by eating bread upon which he had spread a quantity of phosphorous, washing down the meal with a glass of carbolic acid. Although the number of suicides increases monthly, no notice is taken of individual cases, unless the victim destroys himself in some extraordinary manner.
