EDITORIAL lamentations from the Standard are now in order, regarding the lavish use of S. J. Tilden's "bar'l o' money" in Ohio last Tuesday.

SOMETIME ago the naval department issued an order forbidding the employment of local pilots on United States vessels. Recent consequent disasters on the Atlantic coast have caused a rescinding of the ill-timed decree.

THE Central American states are having three separate and distinct revolutions, and the acquisition of property is conducted on the good old principle that they shall take who have the power and they shall keep who can.

MAYOR Harrison of Chicago, in opening the Illinois state fair, said that Illinois farmers are in a critical condition, since the Northern Pacific railroad has opened a country of wonderful fertility, and subjected them to new competition.

THE Iowa and Ohio election results in a Democratic majority in the former state of 12,000 and a Republican majority in the latter of 20,000. The Iowa legislature is Republican, in Ohio it is Democratic; Prohibition has been successful in both states.

THE steamer Coolie, which sailed from San Francisco for Hong Kong last Thursday, carried away nearly 1200 Chinamen, the largest number that ever sailed from that port. Of these over 900 were provided with return certificates. Notwithstanding the crushing and squeezing to get aboard, great good humor prevailed among them. An item worthy of remark was that every one of the 1200 was carrying off with him from \$500 to \$1,000.

THE Villard stocks were a little lower on Thursday. It was officially announced that a syndicate, headed by Drexel, Morgan & Co., Winslow, Lanier & Co., and August Belmont & Co have made a proposition to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company for the purchase of \$18,000,000 of the second mortgage bonds. The syndicate is composed practically of the same parties who negotiated the first mortgage bonds, and includes, in addition to the above, Drexel & Co., of Philadelphia, J. S. Morgan & Co., of London, J. and W. Seligman & Co., L. Von Hoffman & Co., Robert Lenox Kennedy, C. B. Wright and Frederick Billings, finance committee of the Northern Pacific road, will act upon the proposition to-day.

SAN FRANCISCO merchants are protesting against the continued exactions of the Central Pacific. The following from the Chronicle shows the form their indignation takes:

"Meanwhile the Northern Pacific goes on steadily building up its traffic and making daily encroachments upon the trade of the Central Pacific; By yesterday's Portland steamer freight was carried which will make up a train of fourteen cars, much of which would have gone to Ogden and been distributed by the Northern Utah had the Northern Pacific not been in operation. One item was fifteen tons of quicksilver sent to Montana and another the first installment of ten carloads of apples, which are to be delivered in that Territory, at 1 1/2 cents per pound. Every day merchants are availing themselves of the new facilities for reaching the northern districts. Freight will from to-morrow be insured to all distributing points, and now that it is known that the Northern Pacific is not a party to the special contract pool, the Central Pacific may begin to feel that the merchants of San Francisco are not slow to avail themselves of an avenue of relief as soon as it is opened."

POLITICAL prophecy is the most uncertain of all forecasts, but it would seem to be almost a certainty, from the way things now shape themselves, that if Tilden is alive when the next Democratic national convention meets, he will be declared the Presidential nominee of that party.
