Quick Bread-Making.

The Democrat of Carrollton, Mo., says: "On Thursday Jim Lawton invited fifty neighbors to see him beat his own time of two years ago, when his wife baked bread in eight and a quarter minutes after the wheat was standing in the field. At six minutes and ten seconds after four o'clock the Buckeye reaper stood at the corner of the growing wheat. Men were stationed every few feet along the line of grain ready to seize an armful as it fell from the reaper and to rush with it to the thrasher close by. The mill was just sixteen rods distant. At the drop of the hat the mules sprang at work, and in a minute and a half half about a peck of threshed wheat was in a sack and on a horse that began a race for the mill. A minute and seventeen seconds later the flour was delivered to Mrs. Lawton, and in six minutes and thirty-five seconds from the starting of the reaper a pan of biscuits was passed out to the spectators."
