The Villard stocks are steadily regaining their old figures in Wall street.

SAN FRANCISCO is afraid her new city buildings will tumble down before they are finished.

THE cost of constructing the Northern Pacific is said to have been an average of about \$40,000 per mile.

THIRTY-FIVE per cent. reduction in freight charges is proposed on the Central and Southern Pacific railroads.

THE United States government has made a profit of \$16,000,000 by coining eighty-five cent dollars at 100 cents each.

THE Marquis of Lansdowne took the oath of office as Governor-General of Canada, at Quebec, last Tuesday.

SPOKANITEs are excited over the alleged discovery of a silver mine in their country. It takes a gold mine to run a silver mine.

CZAR ALEXANDER does not seem to be a member of the royal mutual admiration society in Europe. He will have to come to an understanding with the ruler of the French Republic.

THE Detroit News presents the result of interviews with 714 Democrats in various parts of Michigan, concerning their choice for President. Tilden leads, Butler is second, and Hancock third.

THIRTY thousand dollars has been subscribed by the citizens of Boise City, I. T., for a branch road from the Oregon Short Line at Kuna and to connect with the main line somewhere between the mouth of the Payette river and Weiser, said line to run through Boise City. The subscription, it is said, will be raised to \$60,000.

THE accumulation of \$400,000,000 in the treasury makes the Democracy frantic. Dana says the Republicans must go. They are becoming impatient to get their hands into the treasury. The accumulation of such a magnificent sum under Bourbon rule, says the Fort Wayne Gazette, would simply be out of the question.

TWENTY-SIX of the thirty-eight states in the Union choose Democratic governors at their last elections. Eleven states elected Republican governors, and one state is governed by a Readjuster. Twenty-two of the thirty-eight states have a majority of Democrats in their delegations of representatives in congress. The Republicans control fourteen state delegations, the Readjusters one, while one is equally divided between Republicans and Democrats.

A SAN FRANCISCO dispatch says: "A most determined fight is being made against the Northern Pacific on all points of railroad differences. Since the issue of the circular inviting shippers to renew their special contracts discussion of the issues presented has become general. There has been considerable dissatisfaction among merchants against the system, but since the completion of another transcontinental road, with a prospect of fluctuating rates, in which the shipper is just as likely to be caught in a tight place as not, distrust of special contracts has given way to reflection, based upon a guarantee that if any cutting of rates is done the old lines will give the shippers the benefit of such cuts. This view of the situation is upheld by conversations with merchants, whose interest it is to avail themselves of the lowest charge for carriage of their goods. While there is a decided opinion among certain merchants against the special contract system, others are unwilling to trust the varying fortunes of a railroad war."

THERE is but one president to be chosen next year, and there are seven distinguished Democrats already elected governors of hitherto Republican states—Cleveland, of New York, Patterson of Pennsylvania, Glick of Kansas, Butler of Massachusetts, Hoadly of Ohio, Grant of Colorado, and Begole of Michigan—not to include Ludlow of New Jersey and Adams of Nevada.
