In 1856, John Dart sailed from Nantucket on the bark *Lauder*, Capt. Chas. Starbuck, for the Pacific ocean on a whaling voyage. She returned to Nantucket with 800 barrels of sperm oil in 1861. Dart was second mate of the *Lauder*, but did not return home in her, having left her when her voyage was about half over. For more than twenty-five years his relatives and friends knew nothing of his whereabouts and have supposed he was dead. E. M. Dart, now at Providence, R. I., a brother, has received a letter from him dated at Valparaiso, Chili, announcing that he is in good health, and is about to return home.

The fact that about ten Chinese men leave on every outgoing steamer from Whatcom for every one that arrives by steamer, is sufficient evidence of the fact that large numbers are arriving here daily, or nightly, rather, from across the boundary line.
