The Orsgon Pioneers.

The New York Sun thus describes the arrival of the Oregon pioneers in that city: "A party of ruddy-faced buxum women, robust in Jersey City on a special train over the Pennsylvania Railroad last evening. The men wore broad-brimmed, soft hats and were leaded down with luggage. Their wives all carried satchels or babies. The men said they were Oregon pioneers who settled in the Web foot state prior to 1854. They had come here with their families to have a good time, and would return to the West in a month or so.
