Pacific Mail.

The general superintendent of the railway mail service has issued the following order: All lines east of the Mississippi river will send mail for Oregon, Washington Territory, Alaska and British Columbia via St. Paul and the Northern Pacific railway. Division superintendents will issue special instructions to the lines west of the Mississippi river and east of the Rocky Mountains, so that the mail will go by the Union Pacific railway or Northern Pacific railway, selecting the line that makes the best time. Lines in Oregon and Washington Territory will send mail for points east of the Mississippi river via the Northern Pacific railway and St. Paul. The superintendent of the eighth division railway mail service will issue instructions to MAGNUS C. CROSBY divert at Blackfoot junction mail for lines west of the Mississippi river and east of the Rocky HARDWARE, IRON, STEEL, mountains that will make better time via the Utah northern division of the Union Pacific railway.

The Panama Canal.

Monkey Hill is the name of the entting from which the contractors of the Panama Canal have obtained the greater portion of rock and earth for the construction of docks, etc., etc. Kenny's Bluff is of the canal and is situated on the west of the bay. This bluff yields stone. Here, also, is a never-failing spring of fresh and wholesome water, which supplies Colon, and is carried as far as Navy Bay. The Emperador cutting is one of the first points excavated for the canal and now presents all the appear ance of a very busy little town, with its bouses for workpeople, its stores, workshops, saloons, etc. Twelve immense excavators are at work in this section, and here are stored rails, wagons and other necessaries. A thousand men are engaged in the Emperador cutting.
