Around the City.

The Oregon sailed yesterday. The State is due this morning.

Geo. T. Myers is a returning passenger on the State.

The Portland city council has impeached Mayor Chapman for high crimes and misdemeanors.

The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Pacific Union Packing company will be held at the company's office Dec. 23d.

A solitary drunk was the only occupant of the police dock yesterday afternoon. Justice asserted its sway by the imposition of a \$5 fine.

The trial in Portland of Bruce Croighton, charged with a murderous assault upon a policeman, resulted, last Wednesday, in a verdict of guilty.

The infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Colbert died at fifteen of scarlet fever last Wednesday. There are no other cases of fever there at present.

Gov. Newell, of Washington Territory has appointed J. L. Stone, H. A. Seaberg, and M. P. Colledge territorial pilot commissioners for Columbia river bar.

The party who stole the quarter of beef from "Jeff's" restaurant got thirty days at Mack Twombly's boarding house. He is bound to eat a quarter of beef at somebody's expense.

Under date of the 11th inst. Judge Callender writes us from Kingdon, N. Y., that he contemplates remaining there for some time. At the date the judge's letter now covered the ground.

The New Dock.—The new dock of the O. R. & N. Co. when completed, be the finest job north of San Francisco. The roofing is almost finished, and by the middle of next month it is expected that the new quarters will be ready for occupancy. The Wharf, which is due to be probably disused, the first lot of coal in the bunkers this afternoon. These bunkers will hold 300 tons more than the old one. The office of the company will be at the entrance from West 9th street.

Change Advocate.—Eastern papers are agitating a modification of the present form of the deed. In its existing shape real estate transfers cannot be made, it is alleged, with rapidity in keeping with the present spirit of the age, for the reason that it has to be left with a searcher of records for several days in order that an abstract of title may be made. The improvement suggested is that every deed should contain its own abstract, and as far as possible, contain the names of the successive owners of the property.

Commutation of Sentence.—The governor this morning, upon the recommendation of the prosecuting attorney and the petition of a large number of the citizens of Astoria, commuted the sentence of Mollie Moran and Mamie Hart to the payment of a fine of \$100 each, they having been convicted of petit larceny at the August term of the circuit court of the fifth judicial district and sentenced to one year's confinement in the county jail of Clatsop county.—Salem Cor., Oregonian.

The question now arises will the culprits accept a commutation of sentence. It is reported that the municipality of the infatuated admirer has furnished the wherewithal to effect the release. The petition was unanimously signed and the interests of justice in the case are as well served by the action the governor has taken.

Damages for Being Blown Up.—The case of John Gilmore against the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, to recover \$25,000 damages for being injured by a giant powder explosion, was called in the U. S. circuit court yesterday. The plaintiff exhibited his scarred and injured form to the jury as a preliminary statement of his case. Messrs. Eppinger & Entwistle were counsel for the plaintiff and Messrs. Dolph, Bellinger, Mallory & Simon appeared for the company. The case went to the jury at 10 o'clock last night, and after being out a little over an hour returned a verdict giving the plaintiff \$4500. The amount sued for was \$25,000. The ground on which the claim was based was that Gilmore was hired as a laborer, and that he was set to work to thaw out giant powder, he having no experience in such work. He was fearfully injured by the explosion of the powder and hence the suit.—Oregonian.

Along the Docks.—The dark and lowering weather which has a depressing effect upon other branches of trade, does not seem to affect the busy shipping interests. In the stream and along the docks all is bustle and life. Few ports present a livelier appearance than Astoria. The number of craft, especially river boats, is increasing, and the arrivals and departures during the twenty-four hours give to this portion of the Columbia river an animation not seen elsewhere. The skill of the Columbia river pilots is well-known and to their judgment and experience is due the immunity from accident which this port enjoys.

The chartering of the Ice King for London direct, about closes the salmon fleet charters for the season of '83. This fine vessel begins discharging ballast today. The Goldenrod's charter expires Saturday, and she is off for Portland this morning. The Ischgren went out yesterday afternoon. The Sovereign of the Sea is discharging cargo at the O. R. & N. dock, and the Imperial is finishing her load of wheat. The Coldstream cleared for Queenstown yesterday with a little over 30,000 bushels of wheat. Several other vessels lie in the stream, some just in, others repairing rigging, etc., and more about ready to cross out for their long voyage to England.

A warrant has been issued and £500 reward offered for his arrest.—The closing of the Consolidated Paper Mill Co., at Chicago through want of employment.—The Steamer Manatee plying on northern Lake Superior is reported lost with all on board.—The annual meeting of the board of managers of the Oregon State Agricultural Society will be held in Salem on the 4th of next month, to perfect arrangements for the annual fair of 1884.—Two cases of yellow fever are reported in a San Francisco hospital.—Nichols, Friedlander & Co., San Francisco furnishing goods merchants, have failed; liabilities, \$400,000.—The feeling in Manitoba in favor of secession from the dominion continues.—It is considered extremely probable that France and China will fight.—Caroline of Kentucky and Randall of Pennsylvania claim the speakership of the next House of Representatives.—D.
