It strikes one as odd that the appalling list of weekly failures, crop failures, lock-outs, and general outlook, is taken by bull speculators as evidence that stocks must go up.

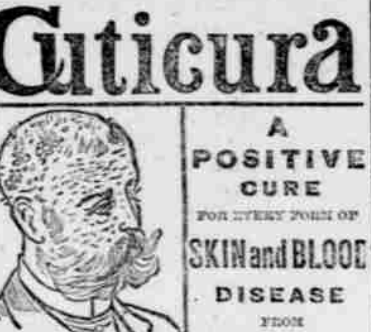
