Some Jews Who Have Never Been Dispersed.

In one of the most remote and secluded valleys in the mountains of northern Galilee lies a village, the small population of which possesses an interest altogether unique.

As I looked down upon it from the precipitous and dangerous path by means of which I was skirting the flank of the mountain I thought I had rarely seen a spot of such ideal beauty.

The name of this village was Bukein. I had heard vaguely of the existence of a spot in Galilee where a community of Jews lived who claimed to be the descendants of families who had filled the land in the same locality prior to the destruction of Jerusalem and the subsequent dispersion of the race.

As it had never been suspected that any remnant of the nation had clung to the soil of their fathers from the time immemorial, and as it is certain that this is the only remnant that has, I took some trouble to ascertain the name of the village, and felt that it was worth a pilgrimage to visit it.
