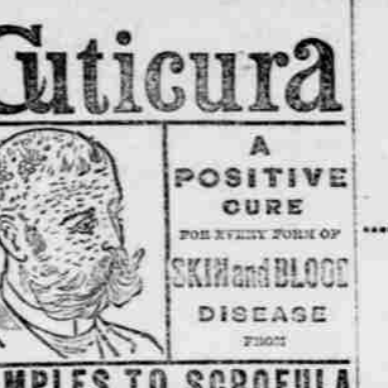
At the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. George Harris at Mount Meridian, Va., the bride refused to say 'Yes' to the question whether she would obey her husband.
