Secretary Chandler reports to the senate that there were ninety-two vessels on the naval register in November, 1883.

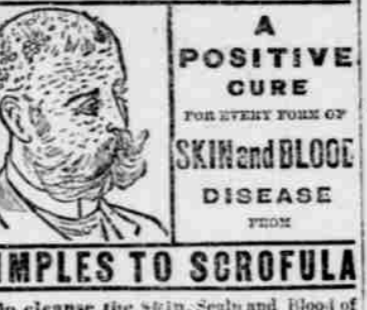
