DESTRUCTIVE FIRE AT THE DALLES. DEATH AND DISASTER IN COLORADO. [SPECIAL TO THE ASTORIAN.] THE DALLES, Jan. 21.—About 1 o'clock this morning an alarm of fire was sounded and flames were seen issuing from the rear of Baden's hat store on Second street, which was soon a glowing mass of flames.

Terrible Loss of Life. DENVER, Colorado, Jan. 21.—A dispatch has just been received from Crested Butte, Gunnison county, saying that at seven o'clock this morning the Crested Butte coal mine a terrible explosion occurred in which from twenty to fifty miners are supposed to have been killed. The explosion blocked the entrance to the mine and the full extent of the disaster is at present unknown.

HEAVY SALVAGE.

The Queen of the Pacific Again Liberated by Fourteen Salvagers for \$50,000. Tuesday evening, says the Seattle Intelligence, Messrs. Struve, Haines & Micklen, and W. D. Wood, filed a libel against the steamship Queen of the Pacific. They represent fourteen of the salvagers who assisted in rescuing the Queen from loss on the 4th and 5th of September last, when that steamer, with the spike-driving excursionists from San Francisco, was stranded on Clatsop spit.

At the time the Queen went on the sands there was considerable of a swell running and few entertained the belief that the vessel would ever be gotten off, as she went on at full tide. The water had fallen when assistance came to her, which, added to the small amount of drift, rendered it impossible for a tug to approach near enough to receive passengers without the intervention of some staunch, well-manned life-boat.

During the forenoon the lifeboat and her crew were continuously engaged in carrying messages and lines between the ship and tugs, and at high water the afternoon of the 5th, with the assistance of four powerful tugs and a heavy strain on the hawser tending to the anchor, the ship came off and proceeded uninjured upon her voyage. The ship is valued at \$200,000, and the cargo and treasure saved at \$90,000, besides the mail and baggage.

Diphtheria is reported at Tacoma. Moody is saving 600 souls in London. Tacoma has organized a board of trade. Judge Stout has begun the practice of law in Portland. Senator Dolph's mother died in Schuylers county, New York, last Tuesday, aged 71.

The national committee of the prohibition and home protection party has issued a call for a national convention of that party, at Pittsburg on May 21st next, to nominate candidates for president, vice president, etc. Newspaper correspondents of leading cities of the country have signed a memorial to the president, requesting him to appoint L. S. Howlett governor of Washington Territory. Howlett was formerly a Washington correspondent.

George, from the committee on Indian affairs, has reported a resolution calling on the secretary of the interior for a list of claims allowed by his department for depredations committed by Indians who have lands due them by the United States; adopted. The secretary of war has sent to the house a detailed statement of the expenditures on government account for the improvement of rivers and harbors from March 4, 1879, to June 30, 1882. Total, \$105,795,401; of which California has received \$1,492,428; Idaho, \$10,000; Oregon, \$649,305; Texas, \$2,166,134; Washington Territory, \$5,566,400; New York, \$9,529,974; miscellaneous, \$39,249,105.
