Street Superintendent's Notice. THE ATTENTION OF THE PUBLIC IS called to the following extract from Ordinance No. 204:

SEC. 4.—No person shall place or cause to be placed on any crosswalk, sidewalk or street, any article or thing whatsoever which shall obstruct such street or sidewalk, for a longer period than four hours, except as provided in section 3 of this ordinance.

SEC. 5.—No person shall throw into or deposit upon any public street, highway or grounds, or upon any private premises, or anywhere, except such places as may be designated by the Superintendent of Streets, any article or thing, broken ware, dirt, rubbish, garbage, or filth, and no person shall carry upon any sidewalk, except so as to be open to pedestrians, any rubbish, garbage or filth.
