The Haight Case.

SYRACUSE, N. Y., Feb. 26.—Following is a history of the Haight case, for which the woman was sentenced today: Soon after 3 o'clock on the morning of February 27, 1883, a bullet was fired into the brain of George W. Haight. He lived a few days in a dazed condition. Immediately after the shooting, suspicion fastened on his wife, mainly on account of her extreme anxiety to have the insurance companies in which Haight had policies notified of his near approach to death. Mr. Haight was Mrs. Haight's third husband. Former husbands were alleged to have died mysteriously, after making wills in her favor. Haight married her in opposition to the wishes of his friends. She soon began to importune him to get his life insured, and he took several policies, and at the time of his death had about \$18,000 insurance in his wife's name. About a year previous he became somewhat worried over her anxiety for more insurance. He allowed some of the premiums to go unpaid, but Mrs. Haight promptly sent on the required money. He finally secured a position as a traveling agent, and was away from home most of the time. On the 18th of February, 1883, he was present with his wife in DeRuyter. Mrs. Haight had become quite helpless from rheumatism, and kept a servant white home. He became so suspicious of his wife that he did not dare drink his own wine. He continued to live with her. On the fatal night Mr. and Mrs. Haight retired as usual. About 3 A. M. the servant heard a pistol shot. She hurried to their sleeping apartment and found Mrs. Haight leaning over the side of the bed looking at a bullet hole in Haight's temple. She seemed but little alarmed, and said that Haight had committed suicide. She did not want physicians to be called, but the servant called Dr. Terman. Haight remained in a semi-unconscious condition for three or four days, and finally died. At his own request he was removed to the home of his uncle. He made an ante-mortem statement on the same day that he was shot. It was to the effect that both had retired as usual. At 3 A. M. he was awakened and saw Mrs. Haight coming toward him with a cloth in her hand. Before he had time to recover himself she produced a revolver from the cloth and fired a bullet into his brain.
