The supreme court of the United States rendered a decision on the 4th inst. in the legal-tender case of Juilliard vs. Greenback, which has been pending for some time and which involved the question whether notes of the United States issued in time of war under acts of congress declaring them to be legal-tender in payment of private debts, and afterward in time of peace redeemed and paid in gold coin at the treasury, and then reissued under the act of 1878, can, under the constitution of the United States, be a legal tender in payment of such debts.

TALKING of the effort to tax money in general, and of the mortgage tax law in particular, the Oregonian compresses a good deal of financial truth into the following paragraph: "All experience shows that the way to make money abundant and cheap is to let it entirely alone. A like policy on the part of the state would make money abundant and cheap for all purposes. But men will not lend money, except at high interest, under conditions which spread the transaction before the world and subject the evidence of the debt to tax charges which never can be foreknown, but which will certainly be three, four or five times higher than the tax charges on property in other forms."
