About Lamps.



Keep your burner and wick tube well cleaned, and the crust rubbed off the top of the wick. 4. Turn the wick down to extinguish the light. Never blow it out under any circumstances. Half the accidents are caused by blowing out. Turn the wick down and let it go out itself. 5. After the light is out turn your wick down as low as it

will bear without getting out of the ratchet, and keep it so till you light 6. Never use a lamp or oil can again. that leaks, or is out of order. Get it mended or throw it away. Don't give it away. Be careful to observe rule No. 2.
