BLAINE seems to have the lead in Michigan by a large majority.

INDIA may well double her wheat export every year with labor at sixteen cents a day.

A FLORIDA paper says that "the South gets more solid for the 'old ticket' every day."

THE White Man's Republican party in Georgia has endorsed President Arthur's administration.

LIFE is short—only four letters in it. Three-quarters of it is a "lie," and a half of it is an "if."

Gov. Sherman of Iowa says that the prevailing sentiment among Republicans in that state is for Blaine.

THE third assistant postmaster-general estimates that postal revenue will be \$2,246,246 less this year than last.

It is stated that ex-Judge and ex-Senator David Davis of Illinois will act with the Republican party this year.

OUT of the forty-one district delegations appointed to the Republican national convention in Ohio, thirty-five are for Blaine.

It would seem from the expression of primaries held in Ohio that the state will be as strongly for Blaine as Pennsylvania.

GLASS bridges are taking the place of wood or iron ones in England. It is made into solidified blocks and neither rots nor rusts.

THE Montgomery, Ala. Advertiser says the southern country is almost overrun with negro preachers, which are multiplying by scores and hundreds.

THE new city hall in Philadelphia has already cost \$8,241,600, and is not yet finished. It is going to be a nice building, and the city taxes will be collected in it.

LINDLEY NICH is the oldest official in point of service in America. He is the messenger of the secretary of the navy and has filled that position since the year 1825.

THE century is gray and aging with its eighty-four years. It will give us five more American presidents, the last of whom will be the chief executive officer of eighty-five million people. What possibilities the twentieth century holds!

TALKING of the Cincinnati riot and the causes which led to it, the Iowa State Register says that murder is one of the safest crimes to commit in Iowa. There have been over 200 murders in that state since 1864, and not a murderer has been hanged.

A SYSTEMATIC effort to develop a demand for the enlargement of the Erie canal, so as to make it available for steam navigation, is evidently gaining strength from day to day. It crops out principally in communications to the New York papers.

THE most crushing objection thus far recorded to the scheme for converting the Sahara into a sea has just dropped from the pen of a statistician who calculates that a canal 100 feet wide and 25 feet deep, with a flow of four miles an hour, would require several thousand years to flood the desert.

A MAN calling himself Dr. Cross recently wrote from Chicago to Sir John A. McDonald that he could unveil a plot matured in the United States to destroy the Canadian Parliament buildings with dynamite. Cross was invited to visit Ottawa, where he is said to have given satisfactory evidence to sustain his charges.

A RANCHMAN down in New Mexico tacked this note on the cover of his securely-locked well: Owing to the disorganized state of affairs in the territory, and the lawlessness prevalent everywhere, all parties are positively forbidden to camp on the ranch or take water from the well. No questions answered, but shoot on sight.

THIS is the way Lawyer Campbell, who defended Berner, secured his acquittal and brought about the Cincinnati riot: Of the hundred jurors drawn in the case, he selected twelve to be "fixed." To the others he sent marked copies of the Cincinnati newspapers containing Berner's confession before the coroner. Under the law of the state none of the jurors who had read this confession could serve.

BROTHERS about the prodigality of Americans, and the astounding projects which they are supposed to be continually forming, are very rife in Europe. The latest seems to be the largest, and is solemnly told by the Figaro of Paris. It is to the effect that "twelve American millionaires have united and intend to build in Jerusalem a temple that shall exactly correspond to that which was destroyed by the Romans in A. D. 70."

It adds the information that two of these "millionaires" have already gone to Palestine to select the time and means of operation.

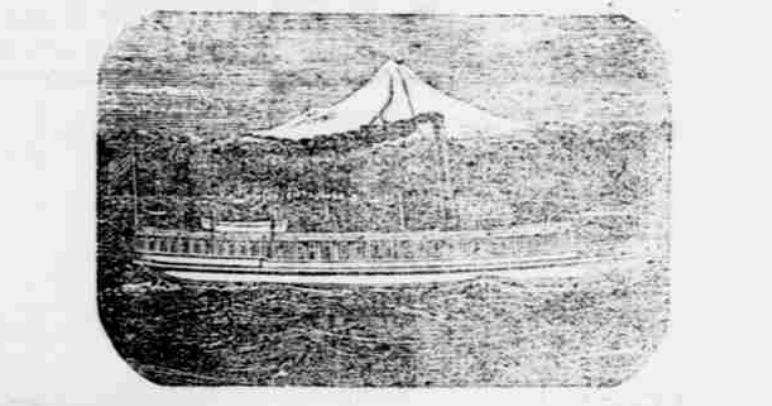

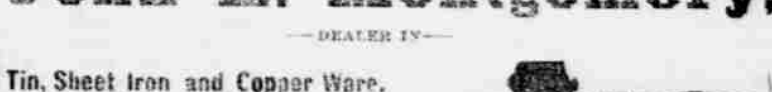
