The Astoria Land Grant.

Washington, June 4.- The house yes terday resumed consideration of the bill to torfeit the Oregon and California land grant. The amendment offered by George of Oregon, to confine the forfeiture to unearned lands, was lost—66 to 97. The vote on the passage of the bill stood: Yeas 134, nays 22. There was no quorum and the house adjourned. The Oregon Central land grant for-

The Oregon Central land grant for-feiture bill, coming over from yesterday as unfinished business, was taken up and passed—yeas 138, nays 25.

Healey of California called up the bill forfeiting all land granted the Celifornia and Oregon railroad, except such lands as were granted for that portion of the road which was completed before July 1, 1880. After vigorous remarks by Cobb of In-diana in support of the bill, a vote was taken on its passage. It stood yeas 138, nays 13. There was no quorum and the house adjourned.


