An Ex-Millionaire's Fifteen Dollar Estate.

The mutations of the fickle goddess who trides with the destiny of human hopes in financial matters was illustrated in an application made to Surrogate Francis H. Woods yesterday. Twenty years ago few names carried with it in Albany the representation of more wealth than that of Jeremiah J. Austin, familiarly known as "Jere." In those days when the river was literally covered with spars, and white-winged carriers of commerce, and the docks and piers were thronged with a busy mass, the leading and enterprising citizen and boatman was "Jere" Austin, the owner of the chief towing line on the Hudson, and a large owner of canal boats. At that time he was considered among the most stable of Albany's financial men, and had he died then it is thought there were not two men in the city who could qualify as the executors of his estate. Soon after 1870 his reverses began and he was swept into financial oblivion. On the 29th of November, 1878, the former millionaire died at Fairfield, Conn., and the application to the surrogate was made for letters of administration on an estate said to be worth at the time of his death \$15.—Albany Argus, May 2nd.

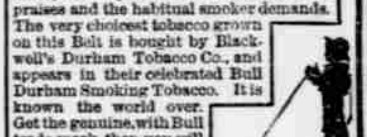
