BOTH presidential nominations were made on Friday.

THE "dark horse" has gone to his stable for another four years, to feed on disappointed hopes.

STEEL rails are now going off in large lots at \$30 per ton, the lowest price ever known for them.

SENATOR PLUMB, of Kansas, was originally a printer, but is now worth \$1,000,000, and is in some other business.

A SIXTY-POUND salmon recently caught in the Ty is the heaviest fish caught in any river in Great Britain this year.

GEN. JOHN C. FREMONT, the Republican candidate for president in 1856, has come out in favor of Butler for president.

TEN conductors on the Northern Pacific have been discharged on suspicion that they were not doing the fair thing by the company.

THE Shoshone Indians, at their annual festival recently, danced for three days and nights without stopping and they didn't call it a hop either.

SINCE January 1st, 192,171 immigrants have been landed at Castle Garden, New York city. In the same time last year 226,305 were landed.

RICHARD K. FOX, the publisher of the *Police Gazette*, is said upon good authority to make \$100,000 a year out of that precious compound of scandal and filth.

PHILADELPHIA has a man, a major in the United States army, whose heart is on the right side. It is the second case of the kind known to medical men.

It is said that notaries public were first appointed by the fathers of the Christian church to collect the acts or memoirs of the lives of the first century martyrs.

THE Western Union company has in the last three years and a half paid \$18,000,000 in dividends and expended \$5,700,000 more of its earnings in extending its plant.

THE Pennsylvania "independents" have declared for Blaine. It is not at all probable that the Keystone State would in any event do otherwise than give a Republican majority.

THE summer journey of Justice Miller of the supreme court of the United States, and his family, over the Union Pacific railroad to Oregon, may be extended as far as Alaska.

THE secretary of the interior has telegraphed to the Walla Walla land office instructions to allow Indians to file on public lands within railroad limits where settlement antedates the grant.

It is stated, by authority, that Roseco Conkling will, under no circumstances, lend his support to any presidential candidate whomsoever. It is not probable the election will be postponed on that account.

It is stated that the Prohibitory convention which met at Chicago the other day and nominated Ex-Senator Pomeroy, of Kansas, for president, is not the regular convention. The latter is to meet at Pittsburg next Wednesday.

LONDON and Calcutta have had telegraphic communication direct, seven thousand miles. How long will it be before the message sent by the operator in London will go clear around the globe, and register itself in the same room in which it is sent.

BETS on the presidential election are now in order. Someone has said that "Betting is a fool's argument." Well, maybe it is, if a man bets the way he believes, regardless of probabilities, but if he bets to win and wins, he is certainly not chargeable with folly. Men oftentimes bet one way and vote another, and win on both bet and vote.

ALREADY some one has raked up an old prophecy that no candidate whose initial was "C" could ever occupy the White House. It is difficult to see what bar that should constitute, but those who repeat the prophecy point to the fact that Clay, Cass, Crawford, Corwin and Calhoun, five as smart men as this country produced, all tried to get there and all failed.

GRAVE reports come from Southern France regarding the spread of cholera. That dreadful disease is reported to have also broken out in St. Petersburg, Russia. If its transit across the ocean can be delayed till the late fall, it is possible that this country may escape. Cholera visited and decimated California in November, 1850, and swept New Orleans in August, 1856. It is unknown in Oregon and Washington, and will probably remain so.

THESE are id round numbers about fifty thousand postmasters in the United States, whose salaries run from \$8,000 per annum down to nine cents. The individual receiving the largest salary in this capacity is the postmaster of New York, whose salary is \$8,000, the same as that of the postmaster general himself.

THE *Standard* has been gleefully rubbing its hands in joy at the published allegation that Blaine furnished a substitute in war times. This was a dreadful thing for Blaine to do, and it ought to count for a good deal twenty years after. But Mr. Cleveland did precisely the self-same thing and yet he is none the worse man for it.

It seems absurd that political parties should go to the enormous expense of indulging in national conventions for the purpose of choosing their candidates for the presidency when by a simple and economical arrangement they could agree upon a choice and avoid all bickerings and heartburnings. In the wild and untamed west there is a fascinating game with the euphonious name of "fly-oo." It consists of placing lumps of sugar on a table in front of the players and waiting. The owner of a lump on which a fly first alights is declared winner and entitled to the stakes. Let the presidential candidates meet at some convenient place with their lumps of sugar and leave the result to the flies. The plan is perfectly feasible, as "sugar" always plays a prominent part in the game of politics. The most serious objection to the scheme is that the horde of hungry office-seekers would not be contented with isolated lumps. They prefer to draw their "sugar" ad libitum from well-filled barrels.
