

A NEW MARKET.

WASHINGTON officials think that the government exhibit at the New Orleans exposition will surpass in interest as well as extent that made at the centennial. Experience at the centennial showed that the public only take an interest in the catchy or showy displays, and that the more theatrical they are, the more likely they are to attract attention. The display to be made by the fish commission will be larger than that sent to Paris last year, or Vienna two years ago. The Smithsonian will, besides, exhibit a full collection of the mammals of North America. A large force of taxidermists is now at work getting these specimens in order. Every branch of the government will be represented. The life-saving service will have wrecks and go through the form of saving life every day. The exhibits will not be shipped until November next, so that they can be properly arranged and packed. A large temporary frame building is now being built on the ground east of the national museum, the rooms of the museum not being sufficiently large for the purpose. Our Columbia canners will have a splendid opportunity to make a display. The directors have written to THE ASTORIAN, and desire a display from the great fish river of the northwest.

THERE is a great deal in a name, after all, especially during a political campaign.
