WASHINGTON, Aug. 6 .- The animportance to the agricultural inter-ests of this country. Already Eng-land has the best facilities for the transportation of wheat between In-dia and England and, indeed, between seven to ten cents a day, it is easy to see how cheap wheat may be raised. The "rigot" or agricultural laborer of India is very numerous. He numbers several times as many as the entire population of the United States. His methods of cultivation are very primi-tive, but with hundreds of millions of these seven cents a day fellows stirring the ground with sharpened sticks, drawn by lean oxen, which, like their owners, are not overfed, the wheat produced is something marvelous. One of the consular officers, writing to the State Department recontly, said that, in his opinion, this was the most serious obsticle that the agricultural interests of this country would have to contend with. There are such large numbers of these Indian agriculturists that they can produce wheat for almost nothing.
