THE Bourbon legislature of Virginia was so busy at its last session passing laws depriving the Readjusters of all rights and powers that it neglected a very important matter. Under the latest congressional apportionment Virginia is entitled to twelve presidential electors instead of eleven as before. But it was necessary to enact a state law to carry the change into effect. The Bourbons failed to do so, and under existing statutes Virginia can elect but eleven presidential electors. The consequences of their neglect have just dawned upon the minds of the legislators, and they have had the governor call a special session of the legislature for the purpose of making A PPLY TO ASTORIAN OFFICE. an apportionment and enacting a new electoral law.

THE act of congress, "to relieve certain soldiers of the charge of desertion," which was signed by the president on the 15th of July, will prove a veritable bonanza to deserters. Under its provisions the secretary of war is empowered to remove charges of desertion now standing against COMMERCIAL OF CALIFORNIA more than 100,000 men, and the removal of these charges will involve an expenditure which is variously estimated at from \$11,000,000 to \$50,-000,000.




