IMMORALITY OF CANDIDATES.

There are two sides to all general questions, and some general questions have many sides. There are two sides to the question whether the personal morals of a candidate for high public office are a proper subject for newspaper discussion. There are two sides to the question whether a decent newspaper that is read in public and in families should publish news involving the mention of debauchery and lechery. A journal which is published for the purpose of printing the decent news of the day, and for the discussion of topics of current interest, will not sully its columns by accounts relating to mere indecencies, and by news which is interesting only in proportion as it is nasty. But there are great and startling crimes of lechery and against the laws relating to the sexes which no newspaper can fail to report without driving its readers to other sources for the purpose of obtaining the news. A decent newspaper necessarily publishes a report of this grave and sensational character, not because it describes a heinous indecency, but because it is actually news and it is a legitimate subject for newspaper publication. The decent newspaper is bound to print the news, not that all public indecency and all exposures of indecency are news, but that shocking and criminal indecencies are classed as news, and the decent newspapers will report them in as decent language as possible.

Some such principle lies at the bottom of the proper discussion of the personal morals of a candidate for high office. It depends much upon circumstances. The degree of personal immorality which may be charged against a candidate, and its peculiar character have much to do with the question. Some debauchees have been great and pure men in public life. Many men excessively puritanical in their personal character have been very corrupt and dangerous men in office. But, as a general rule, a man who is pure in his personal morals will be pure in public office. As a general rule, a man who habitually violates the laws of social and domestic morality, will hold all laws of honest and honorable conduct in light contempt. Men of notoriously bad private characters should not be elevated to public office. The example is bad, even if they do not loosely or corruptly administer public affairs. It may be said with some show of reason that little and remote transgressions should not form the subject of discussion in regard to candidates. The errors of youth and passion perhaps should not be treasured up as an enduring disqualification against men who have afterwards lived long lives of purity and usefulness. But a gross crime, against recent manners and social morals, of recent commission, not the effervescence of youthful blood, but the deliberate act of mature, thoughtful and calculating years, which is mean as well as criminal and low as well as lecherous, should by right-thinking and pure-minded people be regarded as a disqualification in a candidate for high office, and it should form the subject of temperate and decent discussion in the respectable portion of the public press.

Cleveland's Friends Discouraged.
ALBANY, August 19.—The Evening Journal's New York special says: I learn from unquestionable authority that Tilden is far from enthusiastic over Cleveland's nomination. He thinks it was not the part of wisdom to pass over experienced and honored men in the party to take an untried quantity of politics. My informant, who is a personal friend of Tilden, and his frequent visitor, says the Democracy is sick at heart of the outlook, and that Tilden shares in the general apprehension of defeat. The disclosure of Cleveland's weakness with a large body of Democrats, and the other disclosures concerning his nomination are having an effect so widespread and damaging that the campaign managers are distressed. Tilden received Cleveland with the utmost courtesy on his recent visit and advised him most kindly and patiently.

It has leaked out that Cleveland's managers find it exceedingly difficult to raise funds and there is talk of asking aid from the local officials in all the Democratic circles in the country. This is opposed by local politicians, who say all the funds that can be raised in this way are required for aid at home and it will be difficult to carry any Northern state if such a policy is carried out.

Great Tides at St. John, N. B.
The tides at St. John are one of the natural wonders of the world. In the Bay of Fundy the water rises from thirty to seventy-two feet. A ship captain told me that he had anchored his ship with nine fathoms of water under her, and that at low tide she grounded. Dry docks are unnecessary. A vessel is anchored at a pier at high water and made fast with cables; when the tide goes out she is high and dry, resting on the muddy bottom with the water twenty feet away. When the tide begins to ebb a strange phenomenon appears. The St. John river flows both ways at the same time, the water coming down the river and the water going up with the tide, passing each other in opposing currents. The landing for boats, which is made to rise and fall with the tide, is at least 250 feet long. Steamboats, which use other piers, land their passengers at high tide from the lower deck, and at low tide from the top of the paddle-boxes, which are furnished with stairs.

Thirty and Odd Years Ago.

The changes that have been wrought in this country in the past thirty or forty years are signally illustrated by the manner in which candidates for the presidency are informed of their nominations. Now, a considerable number of gentlemen from all parts of the country wait upon the candidate and address him. He accepts and subsequently writes a letter formally giving his views and opinions.

But in those days distance were too great, traveling too laborious and expensive for a personal attendance upon the candidate. He was notified by letter, an answer written and the campaign begun.

Whig Taylor was nominated by the Whig convention at Philadelphia June 7, 1848. On the 10th a letter was sent him at his residence, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. More than a month passed and no reply was received. At first the delay was put down to his crochety ways, but as the time went on his long silence began to wear the aspect of an affront. Thurlow Weed, who had Taylor in charge, grew desperate, and a meeting was actually held at Albany, where the propriety of withdrawing Taylor was discussed. There being no telegraphs, speedy communication was impossible, and letter after letter had received no response. However, nothing was done at that time, and the politicians awaited developments.

On July 22, nearly six weeks after the nomination, the postmaster at Baton Rouge wrote to the postmaster-general that of the forty-eight letters sent to the Dead Letter office that month most of them were for Gen. Taylor. This was before the days of pre-payment, when postage was ten cents. People frequently refused to take out letters addressed them and pay the postage. General Taylor would not take his out of the office. His mail expenses had become too burdensome he said, and he declined longer to liquidate.

Subsequently learning that these letters were important, Taylor agreed to pay and they were according soon back to him. Among them was the letter notifying him of his nomination. So, after it had lain a month in the Baton Rouge postoffice and slowly traveled to Washington and back, Gen. Taylor answered by a brief and unsatisfactory epistle.

The Whig leaders were so dissatisfied that they made him write another, in which he did better. Candidates of the present day are almost as deliberate as he was about furnishing their letters of acceptance, but it is not the announcement of their nomination is kicking about in the country postoffices, or held for non-payment of postage.

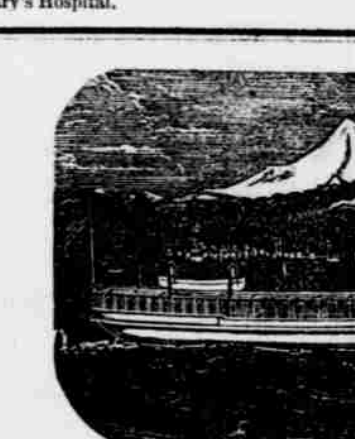
