The Chinese government, which possesses a large and powerful navy, will doubtless prohibit the importation of all French goods. Its ports will be closed against French commerce. Not only will the Chinese need munitions of war but also commissary and quartermaster supplies which can be transported

from New York to San Francisco and thence to China by steamship lines, the traffic over which has very perceptibly increased since the agitation of the Franco-Chinese trouble. China will continue to purchase of England as long as the trade is untrammelled, but the natural highway of her trade is by way of San Francisco.
